

Dear Parents

My decision to leave JCOSS has prompted me to plenty of reflection about journeying and pilgrimage, beginning and endings. I haven't yet settled on whether to call what I am doing stepping down, or away, or on, or out – thankfully I still have plenty of time to decide. What I want to convey and to model is that life brings us to points where we need the courage to take risks, uncertain of their impact on ourselves and on others, with faith that they are part of a journey towards more depth and breadth. A leap into light, rather than into the darkness – that's the theory at least.

In that spirit I commend to you a literal and physical journey that several colleagues are making this weekend — walking 100km from London to Brighton, raising money for the Ukraine Crisis Appeal. Seven members of staff from assorted faculties are making this projected 22-hour trip, which no doubt will be full of highs and lows, darkness and light, pain and joy. All in all, it is another beautiful metaphor of the journey of lifelong learning and endeavour that we hope we can instil in students. We wish them well, and you can sponsor them via their <u>JustGiving page</u> (they are so close to their target amount and I am sure any support is welcome!).

As you can see from the posts included in this round up, we have launched Years 11 and 13 on the next stage of their journeys, through study leave and exams to whatever lies beyond. It was especially joyful do those events wholeheartedly in person, and a delight to welcome Year 11 parents to share in the final assembly. Exams are in full flood at present and both those cohorts of students are in our thoughts – as is the Exams Team who are absorbing a good deal of stress and anxiety on all sides. It is an odd kind of relief to be back with exams again after 2 years without – for all their shortcomings they are at least objective and external – but there are many proper questions still to be asked about whether the whole system of assessing education is truly fit for purpose.

As students leave from the top of the school, another cohort joins to continue the cycle of JCoSS life: though not recorded here, we were once again able to have Year 6 students and their parents in school for their Secondary Transfer Preparation Evening. Two years' worth of students have chosen JCoSS without the benefit of a proper Open Day – whether that is connected to them being the highest application years ever, I don't know!

The most moving points on the journey of this term have been our commemoration of Yom HaShoah and Yom Hazikaron. There is no substitute for marking these events as a physical community, and the commitment and respectful engagement of the whole school, gathered in the Heart Space for the two ceremonies, was tangible. As a Rabbi friend pointed out to me recently, Hebrew has no native word for 'history', only for 'memory': both ceremonies drew on personal testimony (including that of our Shinshinim, marking the days outside Israel for the first time in their lives) and that explains so much of their power in strengthening bonds of community and identity.

The pilgrimage of life and of JCoSS continues, and I wish you a good half term, Chag Shavuot Sameach, and leave you with a final nudge to consider a donation to journeying (albeit possibly mad) members of staff!
