The application window for School Direct opens in October; please make sure you keep checking for course availability as there are some subject areas that are very popular. Once you have completed the application process your application will be forwarded to the individual school to begin the recruitment process with a shortlisting exercise which looks at applicants' strengths and weaknesses. Please remember that we are considering applicants in the academic year before they begin the course, so an applicant applying in October will begin their course the following in September.
