

Dear Parents

There's a theme of change and continuity in the air, and also in the social media posts reproduced in the pages that follow. Continuity is always a challenge in a half term of many part-weeks, but as I surf the final term of my time at JCoSS it is wonderful to see the resilience and longevity of the school community.

Witness the numbers of staff who have clocked up 10 years in the school; witness the three alumni who have joined the staff (bearing in mind the small number of cohorts that have had time to emerge from university); witness thirdly a former student coming to share her experience of social activism at University; witness lastly (not in the posts) those staff who leave and return, tugged back by the JCoSS ethos. This isn't cause for complacency, but does suggest that there is something special about the place.

It is certainly good for our students to have this kind of stability in the staff body, especially when the rest of public life – both nationally and internationally – has seen so much change and anxiety in the past few months. We shouldn't underestimate the unsettling impact on students of the churn and drama in the news, especially so soon after the churn and drama of the pandemic. If as parents we get caught up in the emotions of the news cycle (I plead guilty as charged...) we need also to provide our children with all the reassurance we can that grown-ups are in charge and that there is continuity amidst the change that they experience.

Some change is also good! Last night saw the inaugural Year 7 Singing Competition: it was a wonderful evening, with each Music class singing a song with a title somehow connection to either Rock, Roll or both. The evening was topped and tailed by the whole year singing 'We Will Rock You' and 'We Built This City on Rock and Roll'. It was a great innovation and the first production from the new leadership of the Creative & Expressive Arts Faculty (particularly Ms Berg, Mr Leffman and Ms Whittlesea). Watch out for more...

Perhaps what we yearn for is change at a reasonable pace and with time to prepare. With that in mind, I have been meeting regularly with Dr Lee my successor and we are making the most of the opportunity to have a thorough handover process. She has been meeting key members of staff, Governors and Trustees, talking through the distinctiveness of our community and experiencing the vibrant life of JCoSS too. She attended Open Evening and will also be at the 6th Form Open Event for Y11 students and parents after half term. JCoSS will be a hard place to leave, but the future is in very safe hands, with grown-ups remaining fully in charge!

Despite only clocking up 32 schools days so far, they have been spread over 8 weeks and so half term is most welcome. With apologies to families like mine where different schools have had different dates, I wish you a good one. I hope it will be a change to the routine that allows us to resuming the continuity of the months ahead with resources recharged.

Thank you as always for your support for the school, and to my colleagues whose energy, creativity and love sustain all that goes on here.


