So much has been happening over the last few weeks including a fabulous evening welcoming back many alumni, thanks to the superb organisation by Ms Blitz and her team. We were deeply touched and will always be grateful as a school and as representatives of the whole Jewish community for the time and concern shown by our Prime Minister.

I would like to take this opportunity to express my sincere gratitude to every member of staff at JCoSS, but especially to the JE, IJE and Ivrit teams. I have nothing but thanks for everyone in how they have cared for your children and for each other during these last harrowing weeks. The Senior Leadership Team and the entire staff body at JCoSS will continue to support your children in every way that we can. To that end it will be necessary to sustain some of the current strategies which we have implemented into the next half term.
