
# 28th March 2024

At the end of the session the Israelis gave our students yellow ribbon pins, bracelets and dog-tags, as part of the campaign to bring all the hostages home now.

We were all mesmerised by the visitors' courage and resilience and were grateful for their candidness. After the session the visitors were treated to a lunch at the JCoSS canteen, during which they were approached by students from all year groups who wanted a chance to talk to them. Participants on both sides were left wanting the session to be longer.
